Important Note Regarding Student-Athletes:

Student-athlete names or images may be used by the department/program in their own local displays and publicity materials. Student-athlete names or images may NOT be included on any fliers or other publicity materials that include a non-Stanford logo or brand as this creates an NCAA issue.

Example: A flier produced for an upcoming major recruitment event cannot include the name or image of a student-athlete if it also includes a logo for a sponsoring business or a guest speaker. This would result in an NCAA compliance issue and possibly result in the athlete being declared ineligible to compete. This type of conflict may occur when an event is co-sponsored by a local company or retailer.

Departments/Programs should always consult with the Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance Services for permission to include the name and/or image of a student-athlete in any type of advertisement.
